FROM THE PASTOR

I wonder if I could get a "Veteran" license plate? I know I certainly would like to eventually get one once I retire from National Guard duty. To get a Veteran plate one has to show that they served (past-tense) in the US Military and have been honorably discharged. I did that once in order to go to the seminary, so I actually have the paperwork to prove that I did previously honorably serve in the defense of our nation. The conundrum for me is that I got back in to serve again, but as a chaplain this time. You don't get the plate if you're actively serving, probably because..well, you never know...one could still potentially not be honorably discharged at a future date. Kind of precarious.

When considering Veterans Day, it's always helpful to review the meaning of the holiday. Veterans Day used to be Armistice Day, which marked the end of WWI: the 11th hour of the 11 day of the 11th month of 1918. After two more 20th Century wars it became known as Veterans Day to honor those who served in the military, particularly in time of war, though not exclusively. Remember that Memorial Day, on the other hand, was established to honor and remember those who died in the Civil War, but now includes anyone who died in any war defending our nation. As Catholics, we pray for the living and the dead, and so you can easily say that on Memorial Day we pray for anyone who died in the line of duty serving our nation, whether during war or not. On Veterans Day we thank and pray for veterans still living, particularly those who have physical or emotional wounds resulting from their service, but certainly we remember our loved ones now departed who served on our behalf at any time, too. Basically, Veterans Day is a good day to say, "Thank you for your service" to anyone who does now or ever has worn the uniform.

As I consider my own blending of active and reserve duty, time in between service, and my current service looking toward retirement, I am struck more than ever by a well-known military expression: "Leave it better than you found it." It's something I'm actively doing in what very well may be my final National Guard mission. A second saying rings just as true as I approach the reality of retirement with no other priests serving in the MA National Guard: "Find your replacement." I know that I will consider myself having ended my service honorably if I can meet the challenge of both these adages before I retire.

As we remember and pray on Veterans Day for those who served, it's not a bad idea to consider the service we offer to our Lord within our parishes. As Catholics who want to see our spiritual home grow and thrive moving forward, both those adages apply to us individually. Leave it better than you found it. Find your replacement. Like my own odd blend of service, it doesn't mean I'm necessarily going anywhere soon or giving anything up. It does mean that I need to be able to picture my service as one that improves the parish and invites others into that circle of service for the betterment of all.

Have a good Veterans Day and don't forget to thank someone who serves in any capacity!

In honor of Veterans Day, the parish office will be closed on Thursday, November 11. We will re-open as usual on Friday, November 12th at 9:00am.




The Church sets aside **NOVEMBER** as the month dedicated to praying for the souls in purgatory and all of our beloved dead.






