The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone;
By the Lord this has been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes.

Matthew 21: 42

I didn't know what to write, or how to explain what had happened to me on Mt. Washington. Drawing a blank, I went to sleep and at 3am I woke up with a beautiful inspiration from God. With the foot in a cast, I imprudently decided not to get up, but prayed that I might remember what God had whispered that morning. Well, the memory is short (and shot) so here is plan #2. First things first: I did not fall down a ravine. I was hiking a rocky path when one of the rocks slipped and I fell, breaking my ankle.

St. Paul counsels us this weekend – "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Having hiked Mt. Washington at least 25 times (zero visibility, 50mph winds, temperature drops, etc.), I know the situation could have been much worse, and would have been if I did not realize God's presence. He's right there in the majesty of that mountain, in the beauty of the pines, the singing of the birds, the beauty of the waterfalls and fresh chill in the streams. However, God is and was present in we who have been made in His image – the dozens of people who have expended time, energy, and treasure to assist in my recovery truly reflected God's mercy.

If I had not come to know God's presence, if I had not returned to the "vineyard" to do the work the "landowner" gave me, I would be rolling in self-pity, complaining about the smallest pebble, the drops of sweat, and all inconveniences. In essence, rejecting the cross.

As in our Gospel, if we are true workers, true servants, true Christians, then we will have crosses. Some crosses, we unfortunately thrust upon ourselves out of weakness and poor decision making. We encounter other crosses because of the fallen world we live in. The natural disasters, deaths, or accidents (fracturing an ankle), and so we offer it up. Again, however, if I am a true Christian, speaking the truth in a world of ambiguities and relativism then I will have crosses thrust upon me. And Jesus calls those Christians "blessed".

We sometimes forget that we are not in Heaven yet, where all is peaceful, safe and most pleasant. Jesus demonstrated for us that the way to Heaven is through the Cross. A difficult climb, an arduous journey...but well worth embarking on.

St. Ambrose points out that, "The winepress is for extracting the vintage of the divine grape." And that we have received so many favors from the "landowner." The hedge, the winepress and the watchtower signify that God (the landowner) has invested a great deal of care in the cultivation of His vineyard. We are safe with Our Lord on this journey.

St. Paul embarked on this journey, a little late, but became our greatest evangelist — "Whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."

Our Good and Gracious God is with us on this sometimes-difficult journey! And aren't we Catholics so fortunate that as Our Lady, the Blessed Mother, received Jesus into her womb, that we can likewise receive the True presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Imighty and eternal God of the world, your goodness is beyond what our spirit can touch and your strength is more than the mind can bear.

Lead us to seek beyond our reach and give us the courage to stand before your truth.
