### OF MASKS AND RUMORS OF MASKS

Last weekend, when I was on National Guard duty, I had the privilege of meeting a dean of a New England Catholic college, who, interestingly, has a doctorate from Harvard in epidemiology. We were at the base watering hole, not wearing masks, though everyone, including me, in the conversation had been vaccinated.

I had to ask: "Should I make sure that all the kids in our school are masked as the fall semester starts?"

Her: "Yes."

Me: "Why?"

Her: "Because we don't know a lot about how the virus works."

Me: "????"

The conversation remained very friendly since we were really talking as fellow Catholics, but as you could predict, included the pressing topics of scientific certainty, origins of the virus, and public policy. You know, like the necessity to make sure that the little people of the world... "the public"...don't panic.

Soon the Department of Defense (DoD) will mandate that all personnel must be vaccinated if they expect to serve in the military. As it is, the vast majority of members *are* vaccinated (prioritized right after the medical community in March), yet, after a brief respite, we once more must wear masks in all DoD buildings regardless of vaccination status. The question of that status is beginning to affect everyone from school children, including ours at St. Monica School, to many of you who work for large companies or organizations.

In a similarly interesting twist, as Wing Chaplain on base, one of my jobs is to process the Religious Accommodation requests of service members who seek an exemption from the impending DoD policy on moral grounds. I have a half a dozen requests already and some inquiries from parishioners. My immediate answer to those who have inquired, ironically, has been: "Don't panic, nobody is going to be forcibly sticking a needle in your arm anytime soon. All this needs to be worked out on a legal level first, then a road map determined for those who refuse, and only then will you have some serious decisions to make." My guess is that they will have to leave military service or be vaccinated.

So let me inform you of my philosophy going forward. First, we will follow any protocols that are laid out by whatever relevant authority applies to us, be they Archdiocesan, local or State. Second, I personally will need to be informed of the options that are allowed to make the best pastoral decision possible as we enter into the busy season. Third, my goal will be aimed at allowing the most individual discretion as possible while ensuring the safety of the group at the same time. For example, at Mass we provide protective face masks for those who choose to wear them, but ask those who prefer to not wear masks to charitably give extra space to those who do.

In previous bulletin entries and homilies, I have noted that we all are "the little people." It doesn't matter what degree or job you have, who your friends are, or what opinion you hold: we are on the low rung of the societal power ladder. Decisions are made for us. Nevertheless, the reality is that in a scenario where we finally do have vaccines and therapeutics available and at least some knowledge of how the virus works and who is most at risk, we can use our capacities of faith, reason, and individual discretion to determine a responsible path forward for our parishes and school, even amidst changing circumstances. Another reality is that any of those three capacities that we choose not to exercise will atrophy whether we like it or not. The bottom line, no matter what decisions have to be made in our changing circumstances, is that we should not peddle in fear...or be peddled by it.


# HIGHLIGHTS


