Merry Christmas

Dear Parishioners,

On November 27, 2024, Time Square went dark for a moment and the song *Silent Night* began. Along with this Carol, a beautiful video about the nativity of Jesus began playing with the invitation to spread His light. When I discovered this video, I was in the middle of preparing this Christmas message about the light that has shone, so, I said to myself: "This is definitely the message I have to send".

After the four weeks of Advent in which we have prepared to celebrate Christmas, the liturgy tells us: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone" (Is 9:1). This is Christmas, the joy of the light of Christ that has broken into the darkness of this world; the mystery of the Incarnation, the mystery that God himself has become man and is here in the *now* of our history.

How beautiful it is to celebrate Christmas! How many memories come to our minds of the things we did when we were children and now, we pass them on to the next generation: family gatherings, delicious dinners, traditional dishes, carols, and gifts. Our houses are illuminated with the bright and cheerful colors of Christmas lights, and even though the darkness of the night comes soon because the days are shorter than they are during the summertime, our houses are full of light. I hope we all have the opportunity to share a beautiful time with our families and people we love, and I encourage you to make time to be with those you love. Christmas is a special night and full of light.

Now, what does it means that Jesus is light? In his first Christmas mass, Pope Benedict XVI commented on the passage of the prophet Isaiah by saying: "*Light means knowledge; it means truth, as contrasted with the darkness of falsehood and ignorance. Light gives us life; it shows us the way. But light, as a source of heat, also means love. Where there is love, light shines forth in the world; where there is hatred, the world remains in darkness*" (homily 12/24/2005).

Light is knowledge because Jesus has revealed to us who God is, who the human being is, and what is the way to walk towards God. We are no longer ignorant about the most important mysteries of our life even if we cannot totally comprehend them.

Light is love because Jesus has forgiven our sins with his death on the Cross and has told us that God "*did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him*" (Jn 3:17). In Him we know that we are not condemned, that no matter how far we have drifted from God, there is always hope and forgiveness.

The faithful who have received this Good News, who celebrates Christmas, must remember that they have also become light as Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 5:14-15). Many people walk in the darkness of ignorance about God and about what is best for the human being. Many people walk in darkness because they don't have anyone who loves them with the love of Christ. But we are light.

May the light of Christ dispel all darkness from our lives and turn us into flaming torches radiating the light of Christ. Merry Christmas to all.






