OUR FATHER, WHO ART IN HEAVEN...

Just as man is made in the image and likeness of God so also the father of a family is called to be the image and likeness of the Heavenly Father for his own wife and children. No small task. For us fathers—according to the flesh and the spirit—St. Joseph, the Husband of Mary and Foster Father of Jesus, embodies the fullness of the father's vocation in its wonders and trials.

We will look at a few titles of St. Joseph from the Litany of St. Joseph to guide our brief meditation. For a fuller meditation on St. Joseph, I highly recommend the *Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father* by Fr. Donald H. Calloway, MIC.

Chaste Guardian of the Virgin

I'm starting with this title of St. Joseph although it is not the first in the litany because it highlights three things: St. Joseph's Chastity, Our Blessed Mother's Perpetual Virginity, and St. Joseph's attitude toward his wife. If Mary is a perpetual virgin, then so is St. Joseph! In a world that is hyper-sexualized and pornographic, where purity is viewed with disdain, the virginal marriage of Joseph and Mary offer a path for genuine and mutually enriching human relationships, especially between Christian men and women, especially married men and women. That path is *chastity*.

Joseph and Mary lived chastity through perpetual virginity. While virginity is obviously not the normal course for married people, all human beings *ought to live chastity*. How so? Priests and religious men and women live chastity through virginity like Mary and Joseph. Married men and women live chastity through *fidelity to their spouse*, that is, they abstain from sexual relations with all other men and women. Single people are called to live chastity through *abstinence*, which is obviously an excellent preparation for the fidelity required in a healthy marriage. For men (and boys), developing self-control in sexual matters is crucial. Nothing appears in action unless it first appeared in imagination. Learn to control the imagination and a person has a better chance of controlling their actions. With regard to purity, this is accomplished by avoiding impure images. A steady diet of pornography corrupts the imagination, the desires, and eventually relationships. On the other hand, once men and boys learn to safeguard their own purity, then they can safeguard the chastity of their wives and daughters, to love them for their good alone, with the dignity they deserve as daughters of their Father in Heaven!

Zealous Defender of Christ, Guardian of Virgins, Terror of Demons, Protector of the Church

The titles of defender, guardian, protector, and terror highlight the father in his strength. Although it's not politically correct, it is the case that on the whole men are physically stronger than women just as adults are usually physically stronger than children or the elderly. Now, strength is just strength, it can be used for good or for evil, it can be used to dominate others or it can be used to safe-guard others. The father is called to do the latter, to live *for others*, particularly his wife and his children. He is called to protect, defend, and spread the truth about Christ and the human person in his home and community. He is called to defend what is pure and good, and oppose whatever is wicked or harmful to the real flourishing of his wife and children.

For this to happen, a father must become spiritually strong, that is, strong in Jesus Christ! He must become confident in the truth and this only happens through prayer and study that increases his own knowledge and faith. He must be the spiritual leader for his family and assist in the parish. He must seek holiness through obedience to the ten commandments, practice of the virtues, self-denial, reception of the sacraments, and hard work. He must seek excellence rather than what is easy.

Comfort of the Afflicted

Finally, a father is a comfort in trials. No father wants to see his wife or children suffer. At the same time, what father doesn't know trials are unavoidable, even necessary.

we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. (Romans 5:3-5)

He must permit sufferings and setbacks or the consequences of a poor decision so that they can learn and mature just as he has done. And so the father is steadfast even in the storms of life. He is a rock on whom the family can rely because his house is built on Christ (Mt 7:24).

Joseph certainly didn't know the end of the story when he married the Blessed Mother. As it happened in real time, I'm sure he felt doubts about his decisions and the financial difficulties under which his family lived. I'm sure he felt unfit for serving as the foster-father of God's Son. At the same time, his entire life and vocation was made secure by the presence of Jesus in his home. It is not hyperbole to say that Joseph's entire fatherhood was spent in the presence of God. It is this above all that makes Joseph the model of fatherhood. And it is this, above all, which will guarantee that we fathers serve as the presence of the Father in our own homes and communities. As our Lord said to Philip at the Last Supper: "Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father." (John 14:9).
