The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Each year on the Sunday within the octave of Christmas we celebrate the precious feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. In the readings of the Mass on the Sundays and weekdays of Advent and Christmas our relationship with the Holy Family grows. Year by year our intimacy with Jesus, Mary, and Joseph deepens in the liturgy and in the events of our lives. We look to the Holy Family for guidance within our own families, having the trust and confidence of faith that our families are dear to them. They are with us at every moment, joyful or sorrowful.

Even when our families may be some distance from us don't we still have the communion of love and the communion of our own Nazareth with the Nazareth of the Holy Family? How blessed we are in the communion of faith.

The Holy Family teaches us the importance of praying as a family. Speaking at a general audience in December of 2011 Pope Benedict XVI said the following:

... the Family of Nazareth became the first model of the Church in which, around the presence of Jesus and through his mediation, everyone experiences the filial relationship with God the Father which also transforms interpersonal, human relationships.

... in the light of the Gospel, the Holy Family is the icon of the domestic Church, called to pray together. The family is the domestic Church and must be the first school of prayer. It is in the family that children, from the tenderest age, can learn to perceive the meaning of God, also thanks to the teaching and example of their parents: to live in an atmosphere marked by God's presence. An authentically Christian education cannot dispense with the experience of prayer. If one does not learn how to pray in the family it will later be difficult to bridge this gap. And so I would like to address to you the invitation to pray together as a family at the school of the Holy Family of Nazareth and thereby really to become of one heart and soul, a true family.

In today's Gospel Mary and Joseph provide a wonderful example of the obedience of faith. They do what is asked of them in the law of Moses as they make a pilgrimage to the temple in Jerusalem to present Jesus to the Lord. Their faith which is both spiritual and physical involves action. Pope Benedict notes that, "The Holy Family's pilgrimage was one of faith, of the offering of gifts — a symbol of prayer — and of the encounter with the Lord whom Mary and Joseph already perceived in their Son Jesus."

For those of us who are advanced in years St. Luke gives us great hope in telling of Simeon and Anna who are lead by the Holy Spirit, as we are. In the Gospel we hear the *Song of Simeon*, the words which are sung at each night prayer in the *Liturgy of the Hours*, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

We know that in these days prayer and the obedience of faith in fidelity to the sacraments needs to be strengthened. It is the prayer of our hearts that we would not see death until each child and grandchild, each dear niece and nephew would be filled with light, glory, and divine life in an intimate spiritual and sacramental relationship with Our Lord.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, pray for us.



FIRST READING

Abram continued, "See, you have given me no offspring, and so one of my servants will be my heir." Then the word of the LORD came to him: "No, that one shall not be your heir, your own issue shall be your heir." The Lord took Abram outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so," he added, "shall your descendants be." Abram put his faith in the LORD, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness.

The LORD took note of Sarah as he had said he would; he did for her as he had promised. Sarah became pregnant and bore Abraham a son in his old age, at the set time that God had stated. Abraham gave the name Isaac to this son of his whom Sarah bore him.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 11: 8, 11-12, 17-19

Brothers and sisters: By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age - and Sarah herself was sterile - for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name." He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he has spoken to us through the Son.

GOSPEL

Luke 2: 22-40

Hebrews 1: 1-2

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord. *Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord,* and to offer the sacrifice of *a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons,* in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which your prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted - and you yourself a sword will pierce - so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshipped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.




