

This Sunday, May 14, the second Sunday in May, is Mother's Day, a day to honor all mothers. I had frequently heard that Mother's Day was an invention of a greeting card corporation to make money. But in researching this article, I found that I was wrong, but not completely.

Mother's Day has a long history in our nation and in our Church. Since the first few centuries of the Church, the fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday) was commemorated as a time to return to our mother church or home parish and leave an offering. This evolved into Mothering Sunday, as well as a time to honor our natural mother. This has developed into a holiday which is celebrated in different forms and at different times throughout the world.

In the United States, Mother's Day came to exist through the efforts of a woman named Anna Jarvis in 1908. Her mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, had died in 1905, and Anna had conceived of Mother's Day as a way of honoring the sacrifices mothers had made for their children. She gained financial backing, and, in May 1908, she organized the first official Mother's Day Celebration at a Methodist Church in West Virginia.

Jarvis then started a letter writing campaign to newspapers and select politicians demanding the adoption of a special day honoring motherhood. She established the Mother's Day International Association to promote the cause. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a measure officially establishing the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

Jarvis had wanted Mother's Day to be a day of personal remembrance between mothers and their families. She originally planned the day as one where a mother would wear a white carnation as a badge of honor and where a family would visit their mother or attend a Church service in her honor. But, as is often the case, others took advantage of the opportunity to make money off the idea. Florists and greeting card companies and others began capitalizing on the popularity of Mother's Day.

Jarvis became disgusted and denounced the transformation and urged people to stop buying Mother's Day cards and flowers and candy. She began an open campaign against Mother's Day profiteers and even commenced several lawsuits against groups that had tried to use the concept of Mother's Day simply for profit. By the time of her death in 1948, Jarvis had disowned the holiday altogether, and even actively lobbied the government to see it removed from the American calendar.

With all its commercialization and marketing and profit-making, Mother's Day still remains a day to honor all mothers. We celebrate it every year and, yes, we buy cards, flowers, and all kinds of gifts for our mothers, grandmothers, and wives. But we do it to honor them and to express our love for them.

Motherhood means so much more than a card, flowers, or a gift. Expressing love for their mother is not always easy for some people and cards and gifts can help to communicate it. But express it we must, in words, deeds, or gifts. Our mothers have given us life, so let us love them. They are a gift to us as much as we are a gift to them.

For those whose mothers and grandmothers are still alive---cherish them today. For those whose mothers or grandmothers have gone home to the Lord---remember them and pray for them.

Let us also honor Mary, the mother of Our Lord, today. She is the mother of all because she is the mother of Jesus, our brother. The whole month of May is dedicated to her. The Church is also our mother, and we ask our Lord to help us better understand the great mystery and gift of the Church as our mother.

A PRAYER FOR MOTHERS:

Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, pray for all mothers, so that they will be able to fulfill their maternal responsibilities. Help them to be lovers and nurturers of all human life from the moment of conception until natural death, all the while being examples for their own children. Pray for their children, so that they, too, will be faithful followers of Your Son. We offer these prayers in Jesus' name, in union with the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.

Unfortunately, not all have known the love and care from a mother that many have. And not all mothers have known the return of love from their children that they have sought. For them. A Methodist pastor wrote this prayer:

To the Moms who are struggling, to those filled with incandescent joy.

To the Moms who are remembering children who have died, and pregnancies that miscarried.

To the Moms who decided other parents were the best choice for their babies,

To the Moms who adopted those kids and loved them fierce.

To those experiencing frustration or desperation in infertility.

To those who knew they never wanted kids, and the ways they have contributed to our shared world.

To those who mothered colleagues, mentees, neighborhood kids, and anyone who needed it.

To those remembering Moms no longer with us.

To those moving forward from Moms who did not show love, or hurt those they should have cared for.

Today is a day to honor the unyielding love and care for others we call 'Motherhood,' wherever we have found it and in whatever ways we have found to cultivate it within ourselves.

Mary, our heavenly mother, pray for us all. God bless you all.


FIRST READING


