

Happy Labor Day

Dear Parishioners.

With Labor Day, many of us are preparing to resume some activities that we interrupted during the summer: classes, work activities, catechism, etc. How good it is to be able to take a break during this summertime, and on this long weekend in particular! Let us give thanks to God for making us participants in creation through our work, since God places the rest of creation in our hands to cultivate and care for it (Gen 1:26).

"The conditions surrounding work have made some consider it a punishment, or, through the malice of the human heart when it moves away from God, it has become a mere commodity or instrument of oppression... Other times, work is considered an exclusive means of earning money, which is presented as the sole goal, or as a manifestation of vanity, of self-affirmation, of selfishness... forgetting that work itself is a divine work, because it is collaboration with God and an offering to Him, where human and supernatural virtues are exercised" (Francisco Fernández Carvajal, *Talking to God*, VI). In the person of Jesus, we observe that work is a blessing and a means of salvation. Christ was known as the carpenter's son, and it was certainly because both Saint Joseph and he himself worked with great professionalism; Christ spent most of his life working in silence and anonymity. He taught us that the worker deserves his wages and that he used the image of work on several occasions to speak to us about the kingdom of heaven. Work, "all work is a testimony to the dignity of man, of his dominion over creation. It is an opportunity for the development of one's own personality. It is a bond of union with other beings, a source of resources to support one's family; a means of contributing to the improvement of the society in which one lives, and to the progress of humanity" (Saint José María Escrivá, *Christ is Passing By*, 47).

This weekend when we celebrate Labor Day, let us ask God to bless us with decent jobs for all. On the other hand, as we celebrate Labor Day, let us also remember that we are workers in the Lord's vineyard, let us remember that God has created us to work tirelessly for our own salvation and that of those around us, that the gifts and talents we have received are for the service of others and the construction of the kingdom of God, that it is of no use to accumulate riches in this world if we lose our soul and that if we seek the kingdom of God first, God will give us the other things we need in addition.

Happy Labor Day to all, I wish you all a very good time and I ask God to bless you with all kinds of good things.


On September 14, Pro-Life Americans throughout the country will gather at the gravesites of aborted babies & other memorial sites dedicated in



GOSPEL Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands.—For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. —So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" He responded, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written:

This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts.

You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.

"From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."


PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL
