I've been out of the workforce for 25 years, so I don't know if job applicants still do face-to-face interviews. If that were the case, and I were an employer I think my line of inquiry would be by asking the potential employee first not what position would you like or how much vacation time and sick time do you require? Or, what do you think your starting salary should be? But rather, can you be happy working here? Can you help others to be joyful - your coworkers and customers, those over you or below you? Can you make the world a better place by working here?

Certainly a just wage is important and what I do with that just wage is important. It is also important that I properly use God's gifts and the talents received from Him. "Everyone should make legitimate use of his talents to contribute to the abundance that will benefit all and to harvest the just fruits of his labors." (CCC, 2429) The good worker is called to lift up his work to God, to receive just compensation and in justice to give back to God that which is due. We provide for our family, care for our community, and contribute to the needs of Holy Mother Church.

We saw in the example of our two widows today, the widow of Zarephath and the poor widow at the Temple treasury, that God values our good intention and our generosity over how much we can give. These two widows who gave so discreetly, could never have known that we would be discussing their actions thousands of years later. Jesus was so impressed that He called His disciples over to teach them the importance of things which appear to be unimportant.

Once in a while, when I thank a veteran for their service, they downplay what they have done saying, "I was just a clerk," or "just a mechanic." Yet their work was essential to the outcome of our still being a great country. As long as we do our best and don't give reluctantly, God is pleased. Their service and sacrifice were cogs in the wheels of righteousness, of a brighter future. Maybe, depending upon attitude and intent, the means to a bright future in Heaven.

This old miser had it all wrong. He held on to every nickel and dime he had ever received. He begrudged every dollar he ever gave to the Church.

Then one Sunday, a friend noticed him putting two large bills in the collection. This then happened regularly. Finally, the friend asked him why the change of heart. "Well," he responded, "I finally realized that you can't take it with you, so I'm sending it on ahead."

Well, Christmas is around the corner. It's nice to put smiles on the faces of the "little ones" with gifts and treats. But as the season of "comfort and joy" approaches, let us strive to teach our children about the gift of giving by leading them to the child born into poverty who became our greatest treasure.

Dear Friends,

As you may know, people across several southern states of the United States are experiencing the impacts of two deadly Hurricanes within two weeks of each other: Helene and Milton. These storms created paths of destruction exceeding hundreds of miles. The death toll for both storms is at 280 people and there are still approximately 100 people reported missing.

In response, the Archdiocese is asking the parishes to once again step forward with a special collection to help our brothers and sisters in need. Catholic Charities USA is providing immediate disaster relief with necessities such as water, hygiene kits, diapers, and blankets among many other items.

The Archdiocese of Boston has a proud history of stepping forward to assist people in need. Whether in response to the floods in Brazil, earthquake in Haiti, Tsunami in Japan, or the relief efforts in response to the fires in Maui, we have provided necessary resources to stem the suffering. Most recently, for the Brazil flood relief efforts, the Archdiocese of Boston raised \$245,000.

We will have a special collection at all Masses at both St. Monica & St. Lucy next weekend, November 16 & 17. Parishioners are asked to address their checks to either St. Lucy Parish or St. Monica Parish, with "Hurricane Helene Relief" in the memo. The parish will then send what has been collected to the Archdiocese of Boston for distribution to Catholic Charities USA.

Thank you for your prayers and generosity for everyone impacted by Hurricanes Helene and Milton.

She answered, "As the LORD, your God, lives, I have nothing baked; there is only a handful of flour in my jar and a little oil in my jug. Just now I was collecting a couple of sticks, to go in and prepare something for myself and my son; when we have eaten it, we shall die." Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid. Go and do as you propose. But first make me a little cake and bring it to me. Then you can prepare something for yourself and your son. For the LORD, the God of Israel, says, "The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the LORD sends rain upon the earth." She left and did as Elijah had said. 
PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL




