FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Christmas Narrative of Our Lord's Birth includes within it many journeys on behalf of the Word of God. For example, immediately following the Angel Gabriel's Annunciation to Mary that she would bear the Christ Child, Our Blessed Mother journeyed in haste to the hill country west of Jerusalem to visit her cousin Elizabeth, herself miraculously pregnant with St. John the Baptist. At the time of the Nativity, Mary and Joseph journeyed under difficult circumstances to Bethlehem. The Wise Men journeyed from a distant land in the east to see the newborn King. The Holy Family even journeyed to Egypt for the safety of Our Lord in his childhood.

This pattern of journeys continued with Our Lord's own preaching of the Gospel throughout the Holy Land. Once commissioned by Him, the Apostles travel all throughout the ancient world, all but one of them martyred, to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. Finally, throughout history, missionaries went to unknown lands to bring the name of Jesus Christ to people who had yet to hear it. Some of the most famous and sacrificing of these were Jesuits, Franciscans, and lesser known religious orders who went to every continent, even when unwelcomed, to repeat the same message that the angels spoke to the shepherd's in the fields on that first Christmas: "Today for you is born a Savior."

The question is: Why? Why such zeal, dedication, and sacrifice–even martyrdom–to spread the Good News? The answer is simple: because all of the great missionaries from Apostolic times to modern times were convinced that one had to know Jesus Christ to be saved. Regardless of how God judges the souls of those who've never heard the Gospel, these individuals all burned with the conviction that knowledge of the Gospel isn't just nice to have for a better life, or even the best option among several to answer the myriad questions of life, but that He is *necessary* for personal salvation. As we come to Mass to honor the birth of the Savior, that's a question to ask ourselves: In my labor and my leisure, in my closest relationships, in my mind and in my heart, and in my journey of life to stand before God, is Christ necessary? The answer to that question determines whether He is merely for me a Savior in name only or, rather, in fact, the Savior of my life.




