You may have noticed a few things that are different about today's Mass. We're halfway through Advent and things have changed. The priest and the deacon are wearing different color vestments. They are rose-colored instead of the violet that is usually worn during Advent. The Advent candle lit today is also rose-colored, unlike the violet ones lit during the previous two weeks. And the readings, as well, seem to have changed. The first two weeks of Advent seem to have the theme of "The Lord is coming" and the final judgement. This week the readings have changed to a theme of "The Lord is near," signifying that Christmas is near.

Indeed, Christmas is near. We're already halfway through Advent. Today we are called to focus on the joy of the nearness of the Nativity. It is *Gaudete* Sunday. *Gaudete* is the Latin word for "rejoice."

We use this word "rejoice" because everything about this Sunday is joyful. While the season of Advent remains, overall, a season of penance, today is joyful. The word "Gaudete" is used because of its place in the Entrance Antiphon: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice."


Everything about this Sunday is joyful. The priest and the deacon may wear rose-colored vestments (one of only two times in the year that rose vestments are worn). The decorations in the Church may include roses or other flowers, a rose-colored altar cloth, rose-colored drapery on the ambo, rose-colored hangings, and other decorations. The Advent candle lit today is rose-colored, again signifying joy.

Even the readings take a turn towards the joyful. Isaiah says he was sent to "bring glad tidings" and that God is "the joy of my soul." The Responsorial Psalm is the Magnificat in which Mary proclaims that "My spirit rejoices in God my Savior." The reading from Paul begins with "Brothers and sisters, rejoice always." The focus of everything in today's Mass is joy.

And we should be joyful. The celebration of the birth of Jesus, our Savior, is near. It's only a few weeks away. Everything around us seems to be joyful. Many houses are shining with Christmas lights, yards are decorated, and you can see a Christmas tree through just about every window. But most of these, while expressing joy, are based on joy for the wrong reasons. Our joy is for the coming of Jesus. While Santa and reindeer and elves may make us feel happy, Jesus is the true reason for our joy. Please keep this in mind as Christmas day approaches. Always keep Christ in your vision, and Christmas and all the other decorations will make sense as a real reason to celebrate. It won't be just another holiday like all the others in the year.

Also, let us remember those among us who feel no joy or who experience sadness during this season, for whatever reasons. May the Lord bless them and bring them the joy of his presence through the gifts of family and friends. May they feel the Lord's love even in times of grief and sorrow.


