# The Catholic Parishes of St. Monica & St. Lucy New Protocols for Gathering and Worship from the Archdiocese of Boston

As of May 29, 2021, vaccinated people are no longer required to wear masks or socially distance for worship or other parish activities. The state does advise non-vaccinated people to continue wearing masks.

We trust every parishioner and every family to make a sound, reasonable decision about whether they prefer to continue wearing a mask for worship and maintain social distancing. Parishes *will not* be enforcing any protocols regarding the status of parishioners' vaccinations, mask-wearing, social distancing, or movement within the church.

## **Important Notes**

- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains dispensed for the sake of those who remain cautious about gathering in large groups.
- We continue to record the Mass each week and make it available on our Youtube channel.
- There is no longer a distinct set of protocols for parishes in "red zones."
- We plan to continue to disinfect the churches regularly.
- Congregational singing is allowed.
- Liturgical Ministers (Altar Servers, Lectors, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion) will be retrained and return to ministry sometime this summer.
- For the time being, the use of the main entrances and a single collection basket will be maintained.
- Those distributing Holy Communion will continue to wear masks and disinfect their hands prior to Communion. They will not pause in the middle of distribution to disinfect their hands.
- Communion under both species is not permitted at this time.
- This past year's protocols regarding the use of confessionals are rescinded. The wearing of a mask and disinfecting the kneeler and chair is at the discretion of the penitent.

 Group activities may resume including the serving of refreshments. However, as before, all events must be scheduled, and protocols are still to be determined for the use of parish spaces, in particular with regard to disinfecting the space after use.

In closing, all parishioners should respect the decision of others to wear or not to wear a mask and socially distance during worship and other activities. Further, as we resume other aspects of our worship, this is an opportunity to align our practices to the intentions of the Church. For example, Extraordinary Ministers will only depart from Mass to bring Holy Communion to the homebound. Also, the sign of peace is intended as a subdued and reverent gesture of peace offered to one's immediate neighbor.

Let us give thanks to God that this time has finally come. Thank you to all who volunteered in the innumerable ways that allowed our parishes to function during this very difficult time!

Congratulations to our parishioners who received the Sacrament of Confirmation last Sunday!



# MEMORIAL DAY HONOR | REMEMBER

Memorial Day serves as so much more than the unofficial start of summer. Memorial Day is a holiday that is set aside for Americans to honor the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated following the Civil War, which claimed the lives of more Americans than any other conflict in our history. Every family, every community felt the war and so following its conclusion--as early as the late 1860s--communities and towns throughout the United States began holding springtime tributes to the fallen soldiers of the war, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers. While it is unclear exactly where the first celebrations were held, one of the earliest was held by formerly enslaved people in Charleston, SC less than a month following the surrender of the Confederacy. Nevertheless, in 1966 the United States government declared Waterloo, NY the birthplace of Memorial Day.

On May 5, 1868, General John A. Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance to be held on "the 30th of May, 1868...for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land..." By 1890, every state in the union had declared Decoration Day a state holiday.

As time went on and the United States found itself embroiled in further wars, Decoration Day became a memorial for the members of our military who died in those wars as well.

Throughout, Decoration Day was celebrated on May 30. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.

This weekend, when you gather with family and friends, please remember our fallen soldiers and turn to God in prayer for their souls and in gratitude for the sacrifice they made for us to

have freedom. The following is an excerpt from General Logan's original Memorial Day order:

"We are organized, comrades, as our regulations tell us, for the purpose, among other things, 'of preserving and strengthening those kind and fraternal feelings which have bound together the soldiers, sailors, and marines who united to suppress the late rebellion.' What can aid more to assure this result than by cherishing tenderly the memory of our heroic dead, who made their breasts a barricade between our country and its foe? Their soldier lives were the reveille of freedom to a race in chains, and their death a tattoo of rebellious tyranny in arms. We should guard their graves with sacred vigilance. Let no wanton foot tread rudely on such hallowed grounds. Let pleasant paths invite the coming and going of reverent visitors and found mourners. Let no vandalism of avarice of neglect, no ravages of time, testify to the present or to the coming generations that we have forgotten, as a people, the cost of a free and undivided republic. Let us, then, at the time appointed, gather around their sacred remains and garland the passionless mounds above them with choicest flowers of springtime; let us raise above them the dear old flag they saved from dishonor; let us in this solemn presence renew our pledges to aid and assist those whom they have left among us as sacred charges upon the Nation's gratitude, -- the soldier's and sailor's widow and orphan."






