RCIA - THE RITE OF CHRISITIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is designed for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God, and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. By God's help they will be strengthened spiritually during their preparation and at the proper time will receive the sacraments fruitfully. This is how the study text for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults introduces the process of bringing adults into the fullness of the Catholic Church.

And a process it is. Those wishing to formally learn more about the Catholic faith first enter a period of evangelization called the precatechumenate. This is the period in which Christ is proclaimed and the candidates are given a suitable explanation of the Gospel. After a short period in the precatechumenate and a decision by the candidates that they are committed to joining the Catholic faith, they are accepted into the Order of Catechumens at a Rite of Acceptance. Last year, we were able to perform this Rite of Acceptance during the Sunday liturgy so that all in attendance would be able to meet the candidates, be aware of what they were experiencing, and welcome them into the parish and into the Church based on their election by God.

The next step is called the Rite of Election. The candidates are accepted by God, in whose name the Church acts. This is an archdiocesan event celebrated in the cathedral in Boston by the Cardinal with all the candidates from each parish in the archdiocese attending and having their names called and entered into the Book of the Elect of those who are going to be baptized the following Easter. Some parishes have as many as 20-30 candidates, while many have only 2 or 3. This usually takes place just before Lent.

During Lent, the candidates undergo a period of purification and enlightenment. This customarily coincides with the period of Lent. During this period, three "Scrutinies" are celebrated on consecutive Sunday liturgies. These are celebrated to strengthen the elect in their beliefs and deliver them from the power of sin and Satan.

And then, at the end of Lent, at the Easter Vigil, the elect receive the sacraments, thus becoming full members of the Catholic Church. The period after this is called the Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy and usually lasts throughout the Easter season. This is a period when the new Catholics are introduced more deeply into the faith they have embraced.

There are also those who have already been baptized (usually as infants) but have never received the Sacraments of Confirmation or the Eucharist. They will basically go through the same process and receive Confirmation and the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil with the other candidates. They will not receive baptism again since this sacrament can only be received once in life.

This is just a short introduction into the RCIA process. There are classes or discussions held just about every week throughout the process for the candidates to learn about the Catholic faith. They are usually about 60 to 90 minutes long and take place before or after a Sunday Mass. And it is a great opportunity, not just for the candidates, but for all who would like to learn more about the faith, including lifetime practicing Catholics. You (and anyone else you would like to bring) are always welcome to come to these classes. In addition to learning more about the faith, you would also be giving witness of your faith and encouragement to those preparing to become Catholic. We can always use help with that. It is also an opportunity to teach what you know about the faith to those who don't yet have this knowledge. Those who are studying to become Catholic must go through the complete process, but those who just want to learn more about their faith can come to one or a few classes or they can come to them all. It is a great opportunity for you to learn, to teach, to encourage, and to practice your own faith. It is the duty of every Catholic to welcome those embracing the faith into our Church, into our parishes, and into our friendship. Please come. See the parish bulletin each week for information on where and when each class will be held. We will begin our program in September.
