

Lent is here, let us renew our joy

"The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew' (EG 1). With these words, the apostolic exhortation Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel) invites us to "to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy" (idem).

As we know, lent is the season the Church provides to renew our joy and get closer to Jesus Christ. We do so, with the traditional practices of prayer, fasting and, almsgiving. Along with these practices, I would like to invite you all to join the different opportunities to continue encountering Jesus Christ, get together as brothers and sisters in faith, and get familiar with the Evangelization project we intend to run next year. In this sense, let me introduce what the collaborative parishes will offer you to participate in.

On Mondays at 6 pm in Saint Monica's Church, Fr. Mike will talk about the jubilee year. With the bull *Spes non confundit* (Hope Does Not Disappoint) Pope Francis invited us to participate in the 2025 jubilee year that is celebrated all around the world. If you want to know a little more about the jubilee, what to do to gain indulgences, which places to visit as a pilgrim in the Archdiocese of Boston, and many other things, join Fr. Mike during this Lenten season.

On Tuesdays at 6 pm, I invite all of you to join the prayer of the Holy Rosary at the Gethsemane Chapel. After the Holy Rosary, our deacons will give a little reflection about the Virgin Mary.

On Wednesdays at 6 pm, please let us come together to adore Jesus Christ in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. As we do every Wednesday, during this time of Lent we will have adoration and the sacrament of reconciliation at Saint Lucy's Church, but as something special, during Lent we will add worship music to the adoration time. As well as the prayer of the Holy Rosary, this time of adoration is offered during the entire year, but during Lent, can be one of the best opportunities to come together for prayer. Let us remember that we are the branches and Jesus is the vine, without Him we can do nothing (Jn 15:5).

On Thursdays at 6pm, please join me at Saint Lucy's schoolhouse to talk about our Evangelization project. Spreading the good news of the Gospel is the task of every Catholic, because the person who has encountered the Lord, also becomes a witness of this new life, not only by deeds but also by words. In this sense, for five Thursdays, beginning on March 13th, I will introduce the Evangelization project for our collaborative parishes. As part of these presentations, I will focus on the exhortation of Pope Francis, *The Joy of the Gospel*, but also on the specific strategies we will run to reach those who are not yet part of our communities of faith, such as: the mission one plus one, and the Christ Life project. Would you like to know more about the evangelization? Come and learn.

On Fridays at 6 pm in St. Lucy's Church, we will pray together the Stations of the Cross. Meditating on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ we will prepare ourselves to celebrate Easter with a purified and renewed heart. Please, come to pray, and after prayer please join us downstairs in the Church Hall for a Lenten meal.

Brothers and sisters, let us take advantage of this season of Lent to allow Jesus to get closer to us and renew our joy, keep building our community of faith, and spread the Good News of the Gospel.



RULES OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. (USCCB)




