

St. Francis of Assisi

In October of 2010 my wife Kathy and I travelled to Italy. It was a wonderful journey: beautiful basilicas and the catacombs of saints, but cappuccino and gelato too. Still, Kathy fondly refers to it, with rolled eyes, as "the stones and bones tour"; such is the life of a deacon's wife. We began in Rome and then travelled by train to Assisi where St. Francis began to live the Gospel in a radical way and where his tomb is in the beautiful Basilica of St. Francis.

Francis was born in 1182. In his early years he was somewhat superficial and self-absorbed, but as a young man he experienced a period of dissatisfaction with his life and his spiritual life began to deepen. He began to give away what he had to the poor. At one point on meeting a man who suffered from leprosy he embraced him and gave him money; he was filled with happiness; so began his life of detachment from the goods of the world and his attachment to the purposes of God. His poverty gave him great freedom.

In the spring of 1206 Francis passed by the small chapel of San Damiano which was falling into ruin. It is less than a mile from the upper town of Assisi, down a narrow pathway through an olive grove. From the cross in the chapel Christ spoke to him, "Francis, go repair my house which is falling in ruins."

Francis began to repair the chapel by moving stones and then begging for materials to continue the work. He would come to realize that his work was to go beyond the chapel of San Damiano to the entire Church.

Francis began to attract followers and together they lived a life of prayer, penance, and fraternity. His preaching was very positive. All the world knows of his love of creation.



From Assisi Kathy and I traveled to Cortona, a hilltop town in Tuscany, where we would stay for a few days, using it as a hub to venture out to Florence and Siena. At the time we made our reservations we were unaware of Cortona's connection to St. Francis until seeing an EWTN presentation about it at the time of St. Francis's feast day, Oct. 4th, a few days before we were leaving for Italy.

Cortona is home to the lesser known Capuchin Franciscan Hermitage of Le Celle which St. Francis established in 1221 on the outskirts of town. Francis's room there is now a chapel for quiet prayer. He is called *il poverello*, the little poor man. The room is very small, both in height and length. I was not able to stand upright in it and I would have had to sleep diagonally, but it was just enough for the little poor man.

Francis was a man of the Church, a deacon faithfully committed to Christ and to the teachings of the Church. He gives us the example

that true Christian freedom comes from obedience to Christ and to his Church. He had a great love for priests. In his life we see that we find our joy in God and from him we can go out to others who are to be loved for themselves.

Though Francis suffered the marks of the stigmata he continued to be filled with the joy of the good news, giving his life over entirely to God. He died at the age of 42.

Both San Damiano and Le Celle were very beautiful, quiet places to pray on our journey. How amazing to walk and to pray in the very places St. Francis walked and prayed.

800 years after Francis we in the Merrimack Valley are very blessed to have the inspiring presence of the Franciscan Friars of the Primitive Observance, priests and brothers, striving to live the original rule of St. Francis, a life of prayer, penance, and fraternity here in Lawrence as they minister at Holy Rosary Shrine.





hese archangels, messengers sent by God, are the only ones named in the Bible. In the Book of Daniel, Michael is called "the great prince"; in the Letter of Jude, he argues with the devil over Moses' body; and in the Book of Revelation, he leads the battle against Satan. He is patron of the sick, radiologists and mariners. Gabriel explains Daniel's visions to him in the Book of Daniel, and in the Gospel of Luke announces to Zechariah and Mary the births of their respective sons. He is the patron of messengers and telecommunications and postal workers. Raphael guides Tobiah in the Book of Tobit; he is patron of the blind, physicians and travelers. The church created their joint feast after the Second Vatican Council.
