

# FR. MICHAEL HARVEY

Here we are in the midst of another Advent season, preparing to celebrate Christmas - preparing our hearts, minds and souls for this grand celebration.

Isaiah preaches, "Prepare the way of the Lord! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low, the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough country a broad valley. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed."

Therefore, we want to fill up "what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of His Body, which is the church." Which means, we offer up as Jesus did any sufferings that come our way and also those little mortifications which we willingly take on for our own personal sanctification as well as offering little inconveniences for other souls.

We want to more sincerely lower ourselves. Humbly walk with Our Lady, "the Lowly Handmaid of the Lord," as she journeys to Bethlehem with St. Joseph, the diligent protector and servant of Christ.

Through prayer, meditation, adoration, the Eucharist and confession we will smooth over those rough edges of our character and thus walk a straighter path to Heaven "for our God."

Mindful of this great season, we are especially blessed during this second week of Advent to celebrate two wonderful feasts.

First, on Tuesday, we celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe. The glorious event when Our Lady appeared to St. Juan Diego with a few requests which were eventually fulfilled with help from the miracle of roses blooming out of season, as well as the miraculous image of Mary that appeared on St. Juan's garment which had carried the roses to the bishop. It is an extremely interesting event as you read about all the other tiny miracles connected to the incident, although the greatest miracle was the conversion of 1 million natives to the faith, while 1 million Catholics were being lost in Europe to the so-called Protestant Reformation.

Then on Wednesday, we honor St. Lucy. Normally, we celebrate her day as a memorial, but because she is our co-patron at St. Monica & St. Lucy Parishes, we celebrate this day as a feast, and maybe even more so because she is the patron saint of Syracuse and all of Sicily.

At a young age, Lucy became a Christian and consecrated herself to our Lord. Her parents betrothed Lucy to a pagan suitor, but she refused to marry. He got upset and denounced her as a Christian. Therefore, she was arrested and tortured. Lucy was first brought to a brothel where no one could touch or move her, Then the attempt was made to burn her, but the flames wouldn't touch her. Finally, she was killed by the sword.

St. Lucy is depicted with her eyes on a plate because in order to appear unattractive, she removed her eyes. However, her eyesight was miraculously restored through St. Peter's intercession. St. Lucy's witness (martyrdom) urges us to be convicted in the faith, "then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed." Good Catholic King Canute the Great, of the North Sea Empire (England, Denmark & Norway) declared that St. Lucy's Feast Day would begin the celebration of Christmas because her witness illuminates Our Lord's presence. Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Lucy help us to "Prepare the Way of the Lord."

Enjoy this Advent season, "conducting yourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God."




Anyone interested in singing Christmas carols for Lessons & Carols and Christmas Eve are encouraged to join our Christmas Choir.




