## DIRECTOR OF PARISH LIFE

## MAR 16, 2025

Making disciples is the mission of the Church (Mt 28:18-20), but what is a disciple? Among the Jewish people at the time of Christ, a devout and usually gifted young man would seek out an expert in the Law, a Rabbi (teacher), and ask to become his *talmid,* the word we translate as disciple. After a period of testing and observation, the Rabbi would decide whether to accept the young man as a disciple by telling him either: "Follow me" or "Go and learn the trade of your father." If the young man was accepted as a disciple, he would leave his family, and live with the Rabbi in order to learn everything the Rabbi knew about the Torah and imitate the way the Rabbi himself lived it. *The goal of the disciple was to become like his Rabbi*, and

eventually make his own disciples. The Apostles would have been very familiar with this tradition when Jesus told them before his ascension, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28:19). They would have understood this was the next stephowever unprepared or unworthy they would have felt—in their own call to follow Jesus. Thus a disciple becomes a disciple maker, teaching what Jesus taught and living the way Jesus lived. Thus, making disciples is not restricted to any one category of Christian like priests or foreign missionaries. Nor is it reserved for church employees. Making disciples is the mission of every member of the Church down to the littlest member of the littlest parish. Sadly, many parish communities have forgotten this missionary mandate and fallen out of the practice of making disciples, settling for something else altogether. Consequently, parishes must be transformed in order to fulfill this missionary mandate (no. 28). As Pope Francis exhorts, "[L]et us be 'permanently in a state of mission'." (no. 25, Joy of the Gospel), that is in a state of making disciples.

This task is even more urgent for us in the United States, especially among young people. Only 14% of American Catholics are under the age of 30 (between 18 and 29 years of age), and 9 out of 10 Catholic youth will leave the church, and most by age twenty-three. While these trends are alarming, a recent survey of Catholic adults hints at a way to change these disturbing trends. This survey revealed that practicing Catholic



adults had, on average, *five meaningful relationships with adult witnesses during adolescence*. In other words, a community of disciples witnessing to youth—together with the gift of God's grace—made them disciples.

### One-on-One Ministry

This is our path forward. This is how St. Lucy and St. Monica Parishes plan to effectively evangelize: by prioritizing the formation of meaningful relationships between disciples in our parishes and those who are not yet disciples. I invite each of us to prayerfully discern how we can make this **a** *priority in practice*. Ask yourself a few questions: if you had to make one disciple, one saint for Christ, how would you do it? What steps would you take? How would you begin? What resources and support would you need or want from your parish and its leaders? Finally, ask yourself who is one person in your sphere of influence at home, at work, at school that you could invite to follow Jesus as his disciple? These are the questions we in ministry have been asking ourselves and which we invite you to join us in asking. Not just as a theoretical exercise but in order to take concrete steps toward making disciples of Jesus Christ.

### Future Steps

The parish is currently training a handful of disciples to make disciples of adults and young people, but it is just a beginning. Many more—all of us—will eventually be called to play our part. In the meantime, we ask you to (1) pray for our parishes to fulfill our missionary mandate in Methuen. (2) Prayerfully reflect on how you can do your part. We do not know God's plan for every individual, and the Lord has given each of us special graces to accomplish the work of his kingdom. What has God put on your heart and how can you contribute to the mission of our parishes? And (3) start the practice of inviting people to join you for mass, adoration, confessions or any other opportunities. Together we will win disciples for Christ!

In the Gospel this weekend, the Father's voice is heard from Heaven - "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him." 
On March 18th we celebrate the optional memorial of St. Cyril of Jerusalem. He was a devoted pastor, teacher and bishop who endured exile 3 times and throughout his life (d. 386) maintained a devotion to the liturgy and the sacraments.

And not to ruin the surprise, but Mar17th is the Feast of St. patrick. Because St. Patrick is the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Boston, it too is a high feast day like St. Joseph's feast. Thus all are dispensed from the regular Lenten disciplines.

Someone will have to enjoy Fr. Patrick Armano's corned beef and cabbage as he will be on a pilgrimage to Sicily/Italy. We will keep the pilgrims in our prayers and maybe we could pray to St. Joseph who traveled quite a bit with Our Lady and Jesus. The mystics also point out how St. Joseph and Our Lady would not only make pilgrimages to the holy temple but also to the sites of the Annunciation and the Nativity. Let's ask St. Joseph and Our Lady to help us discern a possible minipilgrimage to Holy Rosary Shrine, an official Jubilee Year Pilgrimage Site.

Last Sunday we celebrated the *Rite of Sending a Catechumen* and the *Rite of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion* at the 10:30 a. m. Mass at St. Lucy Church. Our candidates Joseph, Christina and Kathleen are fulfilling a life of conversion centered in Christ and will receive the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil.

After Mass our catechumen John travelled to Holy Cross Cathedral with his sons, Ryan and Eli, Fr. Marcos, Dcn. John Pierce and Dcn. John Kobrenski, who will be John's godfather, to celebrate the *Rite of Election of Catechumens* with Bishop Mark O'Connell and 482 other catechumens in the Archdiocese of Boston who will enter into the Church at the Easter Vigil.

At the celebration of the "Election" the catechumenate itself comes to an end. The Elect are those who have been chosen by the Bishop to go forward to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation. The Elect participate in a time of intense spiritual preparation during Lent, called the period of purification and enlightenment, before receiving the sacraments of initiation. It is called "Election" because the admission made by the Church is founded on election by God, in whose name the Church acts. The elect are encouraged to follow Christ with greater generosity.





### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON**

Psalm 27:8-9

I long to see you face to face; Lord, do not look away from me.




