Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!

Philippians 4:4

For the past two weeks we have been praying "thy kingdom come" as we anticipate and prepare for the Lord's coming. With *Gaudete* (Rejoice) Sunday, we now have a deeper and more joyous expectation that Jesus is near. We have moved from an anticipatory hope to a more confident belief, as the prophet Zephaniah proclaims that "the King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst." The prophet Isaiah concurs, "Great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel." He is near!

Helping us to "rejoice" this weekend, we prayed the shortest chapter in the book of Isaiah, and my favorite. Although we did leave out verse one:

"On that day, you will say: I give you thanks, O Lord; though you have been angry with me, your anger has abated, and you have consoled me."

I don't think it is so much anger that the Old Testament writers attributed to God when the Israelites rebelled and sinned, but rather a disappointment, displeasure, or concern that we have not reciprocated the love of God our Father, that we have separated ourselves from His love.

However, when Isaiah, the Jews, and hopefully you and I, turn back to God, more fully to God, when we "make straight the way of the Lord" (in the sacrament of confession), and "refrain from every kind of evil," we will boldly proclaim:

"God indeed is my savior; I am confident and unafraid. My strength and my courage is the Lord And He has been my savior."

What great uplifting words we are given to meditate on this *Gaudete* Sunday. Even in our dryness, our weakness, fears, and rebellious hearts, God still comes to cleanse, heal, vindicate, strengthen and ransom.

How can you not rejoice "in Thanksgiving" in Him, when "He will rejoice over you with gladness and renew you in His love!?" The key is to follow the counsel of St. Paul who says, "Rejoice in the Lord always."


Joy is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit and St. Josemaria certainly embodied this Christian virtue because he truly lived a meaningful life, understanding in his heart that he was a child of God. Here are four points for meditation from *The Way*.

- **658** If things go well, let's rejoice, blessing God, who makes them prosper. And if they go wrong? Let's rejoice, blessing God, who allows us to share the sweetness of his cross.
- **659** The cheerfulness you should have is not the kind we might call physiological-like that of a healthy animal. Rather, it is the supernatural happiness that comes from the abandonment of everything, including yourself, into the loving arms of our Father God.
- **665** I want you always to be happy, for cheerfulness is an essential part of your way. Pray that the same supernatural joy may be granted to us all.
- **864** Being a child, you'll have no cares; children quickly forget what troubles them and return to their usual games. With abandonment, therefore, you won't have to worry, for you will rest in the Father.

Continue to travel through this Advent season under the guiding hands of our Father and the gentle touch of Mary, our Hope, Seat of Wisdom.
