Conversion to Christ one person at a time, little by little, must be celebrated

Over the past few decades as we have lamented a stark decline in modesty in dress and behavior. We often note the negative role that many in Hollywood and in the music industry play in this decline.

Lady Gaga has become for this decade what Madonna had been in the 1980's. A Catholic, educated in a Catholic school, but using Catholic symbols in videos in sacrilegious ways while wearing outfits that would often cause my mom to say, with a touch of sarcasm, "that poor girl is going to catch Pneumonia!" I often thought the best thing about the Patriots comeback in the Super Bowl vs Atlanta was that it helped us to forget the Lady Gaga half-time performance.

Happily lately, Lady Gaga was photographed with a Catholic priest after a Mass. She posted that picture on line with a quote praising his homily on Eucharist as medicine for sinners. She has posted a picture of herself devoutly praying with a rosary and went to church with her boyfriend beautifully and modestly dressed and after the service took the time to lift up the church musician complementing the music. Lady Gaga was criticized on line after posting the picture with the priest, as just another Hollywood star following a popular trend of quoting Jesus, or religion in general, while still living immorally. Lady Gaga responded with this note on line:

Dear Becky,

"Mary Magdalene washed the feet of Christ and was protected and loved by him. A prostitute, someone society shamed, as if she and her body was a man' s trash can. He loved her and did not judge. He let her cry over him and dry his feet with the hair of a harlot. We are not just "celebrities" we are humans and sinners, children, and our lives are not void of values because we struggle. We are as equally forgiven as our neighbor. God is never a trend no matter who the believer." – Lady Gaga.

It would be impossible for God not to be at work in the heart of a person capable of penning such a profoundly beautiful note. How important to remember that in God's eyes Lady Gaga always was, and still is, Stefani Joanne Angelina Germanotta. Sometimes we forget that "celebrities" are real people, real people that live in a world where temptation is perhaps much stronger than it is in the lives of us "normal" people. In the end, Stefani is a "normal" person, a beloved and precious daughter of God. Her past does not change that. May she continue to come to a deeper knowledge of that reality as she grows, even if it's little-by-little, into the image of Christ. Perhaps we know someone who has forgotten who they are, even if they never changed their name. Maybe you will be the one to offer an invite or a kind word that will be the spark to remember who they are.
