

This year, for the forty-fourth time since the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision, hundreds of thousands of people, mostly young people, have come together in Washington, DC, to peacefully demonstrate this disaster that has literally resulted in the destruction of approximately 55 million American lives since 1973, and has adversely impacted millions more. Our youth minister Sammie Moore and I have led a sizable contingent from our parishes to the March for Life this year. For me, it is always a privilege, and a great sign of hope, to see how many people there are who care so deeply about preserving what God has created.

The issue of abortion causes a great deal of controversy to this day. The fact that it is so contentious after all these years shows that great numbers of people, including many who have not received any particular instruction in ethics or moral theology, can see that there is a grave injustice done when an innocent human life is snuffed out for any reason whatsoever. This is a source of encouragement to those who fight against this great injustice, but there is still so much work to do. There are many who can agree that this is a great moral evil, but who prefer to maintain the status quo. Even some people who consider themselves to be "prolife" are politically opposed to making abortion illegal.

I would like to propose that we see our position on this important issue in a different light, perhaps. I would propose that we look back to the Declaration of Independence, and the first right which the Creator has endowed us with, the right to life. All innocent human beings have a right to life. Under no circumstances many an innocent human being be directly killed. Of course, rights always come with obligations. We who live and who believe that everyone has the right to live must do our part. Certainly we must all pray. Please pray that our efforts on behalf of the least of God's children will bear fruit, even if it does not happen right away. Let us also pray that we will all recognize that the issues around the right to life do not stop once a child is born.

We must do our best for those who are poor, and who may struggle with the idea of abortion. The work of pregnancy care centers is so important, in that they show young women that there are alternatives, and that they are loved. They also help young people to see that it is possible to live a life of chastity, even if they have made mistakes in the past. It is vital that we spread the message of forgiveness far and wide. God desires that everyone should come back to Him, no matter what.

We also need to be aware that the forces of evil are trying to soften our minds to the idea of physician assisted suicide, which will almost certainly be on our ballot again in 2018. We need to show that all life is precious, and that we never lose our dignity before God, or our fellow man due to age, illness, or disability. For our part, we can ask God to help us to live joyfully, even in the hard times, and to care for all of those who need us, and to give them everything they need. Living the Christian life is hard, which should not be surprising given what Jesus gave in order that we be saved, but Jesus assures us that He will provide us with all the grace we need to do what needs to be done. Please pray for everyone who defends the right to life, and especially pray that God will preserve the youth of our parish.




